- 5. Human Services and Resources → helping people and government
- 6. Business, Marketing, and Management → business, ads, and money





PAYCHECK

Paychecks make most workers smile. It feels good to get paid. But, it's up to you to check your paycheck. Don't get cheated out of your money. Make sure everything is correct.

John Allen is a clerk. He works for City Home Healthcare (300 North St, Leander, TX 78641). John's address is 504 Oak Lane, Leander, TX 78641. John looked at his paycheck carefully. He noticed a huge mistake!

Here is John's paycheck:



If you see a mistake on your paycheck, don't cash the check. The first thing to do is find the right person to help you. Usually the right person isn't your boss. Try the payroll office or the human resources office.

When you start a job, you fill out a W-4 form. It determines the taxes that are taken out of your paycheck. In January, your employer will give you a W-2 form. The W-2 shows the money earned and tax totals for the past year. Keep your W-2. You must have this information to file your taxes.
